

Sec. 9.603. - Ignition, discharge, and use of consumer fireworks.

A person shall not ignite, discharge, or use consumer fireworks in the city; provided, however, this prohibition shall not apply to the use of consumer fireworks during the hours of 8:01 a.m. and 12 midnight on the day preceding, the day of, and the day after a national holiday in accordance with provisions of the Act, except that with respect to New Year's Day only, this prohibition shall not apply to the use of consumer fireworks during the hours of midnight and 1:00 a.m. and during the hours of 8:01 a.m. and 12 midnight, in accordance with provisions of the Act.

Sec. 9.602. - Definitions.

- (1) *Act* means the Michigan Fireworks Safety Act, Public Act No. 256 of 2011, MCL 28.451 et seq., as amended, which is hereby adopted by reference as a part of this chapter.
- (2) *Consumer fireworks*, as defined in the Act, means fireworks devices that are designed to produce visible effects by combustion, that are required to comply with the construction, chemical composition, and labeling regulations promulgated by the United States consumer product safety commission, and other requirements in the Act. "Consumer fireworks" does not include low-impact fireworks.
- (3) *Fireworks*, as defined in the Act, means any composition or device, except for a starting pistol, a flare gun, or a flare, designed for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion, deflagration, or detonation.
- (4) *Low-impact fireworks*, as defined in the Act, means ground and handheld sparkling devices.
- (5) *Minor* means an individual who is less than eighteen (18) years of age.
- (6) *National holiday* means the following legal public holidays:
 - (a) New Year's Day, January 1;
 - (b) Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., the third Monday in January;
 - (c) Washington's Birthday, the third Monday in February;
 - (d) Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;
 - (e) Independence Day, July 4;
 - (f) Labor Day, the first Monday in September;
 - (g) Columbus Day, the second Monday in October;
 - (h) Veteran's Day, November 11;
 - (i) Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November; and
 - (j) Christmas Day, December 25.
